

ANN SLEIGHT

Ann C. Sleight (pronounced “slate”) joined f:67 in the early 1970’s at the suggestion of another past member, Doug Lince, who was then the club President. Following a “sabbatical leave” and absence from the club, Ann began attending again, and became acquainted with J.G. Archibald, another former club member. She says that “Arch” started a small group monthly meeting at his home in Poulsbo, called *The Silver Image Artists*. Arch was a very proficient lab worker as well as photographer. He taught Ann and others basic techniques of black and white photo finishing. Arch passed away in November, 1994. Ann has kept the monthly meetings going since then with a group of about 15 people, now evaluating silver prints and digital black and white prints. Each print, which must be self-printed, is critiqued but no awards or citations are given.

Ann now owns Arch’s double-wide mobile home and 3 acres of land in Poulsbo. She reports keeping busy in the summer with lawn mowing and garden care. She is also a volunteer land steward at the Nature Conservancy’s Foulweather Bluff Preserve. Her special interest is birds. Ann was an anthropology instructor at Olympic College from the fall of 1964 to July 1994. She took most of her graduate and undergraduate work at the University of Michigan.

Ann occasionally makes it to f:67 print nights with her silverprints, and helps as commentator from time to time.
