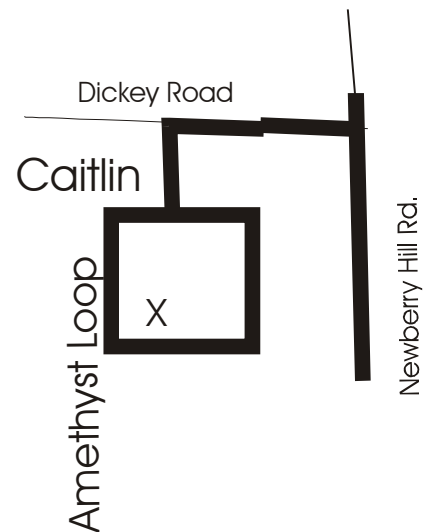

PHOTO-TOPICS

The f:67 exhibition categories for May, June and July are defined here. Note that print category "Open" is now defined under "General".

GENERAL

Any subject is acceptable.

PHOTO-JOURNALISM

Events and situations that tell a story. Also included is man's involvement in life photographed in a story-telling manner: people doing things, humor, action, human interest and expressive portraits.

PLANTS

Flowering plants, non- flowering plants (fungi, lichens, mosses, ferns), habitats and fossil plant life. **NOT** eligible are photographs of museum habitats or groups -- or similar subjects which are no longer alive. Also **INELIGIBLE** are photographs which depict hybrid plants or horticultural varieties of plants.

ANIMALS

Any living member of the animal kingdom, wild or domestic. (Also includes insects, spiders, sea creatures, etc).

ARCHITECTURE

(one of our special categories)

The art and science of designing and erecting buildings—The planning and design evidenced in any structure or arrangement,.
